Leaving a Gift in Your Will





There are three ways to leave a gift in your will.

To leave a gift in your will, you can use the sample language below to share your wishes with your lawyer or estate planner:

Type of bequest	Sample language for your will
Specific Bequest: To set aside a certain dollar amount or asset to be donated.	"I give to The Dementia Society of Ottawa and Renfrew County the sum of \$ from my estate to be used for the greatest."

Type of bequest	Sample language for your will
Percentage Bequest: To give a percentage of your total estate.	"I give to The Dementia Society of Ottawa and Renfrew County% of my estate, to be used for the greatest needs of the Society."

Type of bequest	Sample language for your will
Residual Bequest: To give a percentage of your remaining estate after all other gifts have been removed.	"I give to The Dementia Society of Ottawa and Renfrew County% of the residue of my estate, to be used for the greatest needs of the Society."

As part of making your will, or revising an existing will, please consult with a lawyer and your family. To leave a charitable gift in your will, you must include the full legal name of the charity.
